The Town of Wallkill hosts the area's premier Summer Day Camp at Circleville Park. For 8 weeks each summer, we provide daily activities ranging from traditional sports like tennis, soccer, basketball, and baseball to arts & crafts, "Game Zone," and "Ultimate Journey," a hiking and exploring program that takes full advantage of all the park has to offer. The lake provides us the opportunity to offer boating, fishing, free swim, and instructional swim daily.

Camp runs from 9am to 3pm daily. We offer before and after camp activities as well. Before camp activities are held 6am to 9am and after camp activities are held 3pm to 6pm. That's as much as 12 hours of **FUN** each day!

We keep camp costs affordable but there are still MANY families who are unable to participate due to financial challenges. Because **EVERY** kid deserves a **GREAT** camp experience!

INTRODUCING THE GREAT FUTURES FUND

Every day, they are working hard to develop a strong sense of community pride and civic engagement that will last a lifetime. When there isn't enough food at home, they enjoy healthy snacks so they can strive. They are having fun and learning to make good choices on their way to adulthood.

To ensure that we're doing all we can to achieve our mission the Town of Wallkill Boys & Girls Club— thanks in part to gift from a generous donor — recently established **THE GREAT FUTURES FUND** at the Community Foundation of Orange and Sullivan.

Our forward-thinking Board of Directors, with donor consent, established the Great Futures Fund to create a vehicle for immediate and planned gifts that will support our Clubs and provide for their long-term sustainability.

Anyone can make a gift to the fund at any time and donations can be made in honor or memory of a family member, friend or loved one.

We welcome and strongly encourage all supporters to consider leaving a bequest in their will to the Great Futures Fund. Not only will this help reduce estate taxes, but it will also leave a lasting legacy for an organization that was so important to you during your life.

The Town of Wallkill Boys & Girls Clubs, Inc. was incorporated in 1993. Our mission is to enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as caring, productive, responsible citizens.

The Clubs originally provided weekend recreation opportunities in vacant storefronts in Orange Plaza in Middletown, and have grown to include before- and afterschool programs, Summer Day Camps and specialized intensive programming for tweens and teens. We currently serve communities throughout Northern Orange & Sullivan Counties, including Fallsburg, Liberty, Monticello, Pine Bush, and the Town of Wallkill.

In 2015-2016, our Boys & Girls Clubs served 1,675 registered members, a 49% increase over the 2009 enrollment. Through community engagement in Northern Orange & Sullivan Counties, we served an additional 6,000 children in 2015-2016, for a total of 7,675 children. We currently host 9 programs in Fallsburg, Liberty, Monticello, Pine Bush and the Town of Wallkill.

More than 75% of our registered Club kids live at, or below poverty and 50% live in single-parent/guardian or foster care families, which is why we will serve more than 45,000 meals and 35,000 healthy snacks to our Club kids in 2015-2016. We are able to provide these programs and these meals, thanks in part to the funds raised through our fundraising efforts.

During the school year, the Clubs provide afterschool programming in 9 locations daily, serving more than 500 Club kids each day, and 2 before-school programs serving 60 children each day.

KIDS AND TEENS NEED CLUBS

- Juvenile violent crime escalates between 3pm and 7pm on school days
- 1 out of 6 students fails to graduate from high school on time
- 1 out of 5 young people lives in poverty
- 43 million kids lack access to summer learning programs, putting them at a significant disadvantage at the start of each school year.

For Ethan, many days in the beginning of the year ended with a Boys & Girls Club staff member speaking to his mom about his behavior and school work.

Our staff worked every day with Ethan, first ensuring he received adequate guidance and help with his homework, then creating a sense of belonging, and supportive relationships.

Happily, over the past few months, we've seen a big positive change in Ethan. He has started to socialize a lot more at program and is making many new friends. His verbal outbursts have stopped and he is actively participating in scheduled activities every day. Ethan is also keeping up with all his schoolwork and completes it during our Power Hour. The talks with Ethan's mom when she picks him up each day are now filled with positive outcomes, big smiles, and hugs.
