

In the early '90s, guided by a vision to give other children the kinds of opportunities he gave his own kids, Steven E. Plain and a group of people from the Town of Wallkill and the Wallkill East Rotary started local recreational youth programs. Sometime later and rather serendipitously, Steve met Brian Skanes who had relocated to Middletown and worked for Boys & Girls Clubs of America. The rest as they say is history and today, every day, over 300 kids in 9 locations in Northern Orange and Sullivan Counties have a safe place to go after school to work on creating **GREAT FUTURES** for themselves.

On October 14, nearly 200 of our most avid friends and donors joined us at the Clubhouse in Circleville to honor Steve at our 4th annual GROWN HERE dinner and live wine auction.

We're pleased to report that the event, hosted by Jay Anthony, raised \$35,000 to support programming in Northern Orange and Sullivan Counties.

The fun-filled night featured a robust silent auction and a rare and unique live wine auction conducted by Dr. David Ainbinder. Homegrown band Somerville provided a fantastic musical backdrop to the evening.

Tributes from Steve's family, friends and community supporters included recognition from the Town of Wallkill, Sen. John Bonacic, NYS Assemblywoman Aileen Gunther, Orange County Executive Steve Neuhaus, and Congressman Sean Patrick Maloney. The Boys & Girls Clubs of America also honored Steve and Maureen as they were inducted into the Jeremiah Milbank's Society for their generosity to the Club.

The evening featured dishes curated by five local chefs...
